1. The workmen unions are planning to strike work on Mondays, the 27th of September pressing their demands that are already engaging the attention of the Bank Management.

2. Our bank never shows indifference to the reasonable genuine demands and aspirations of its workforce as could be seen from the various proactive welfare measures put in place by the bank.

3. The proposed strike action is therefore unjust and illegal especially when timed at the close of the half-year when we redouble our efforts towards attaining new heights in business.

4. It is also noted that when our bank is taking all out efforts to overcome the shadow of PCA. The vested interest is trying to disturb the conducive environment of Bank.

5. What is more unfortunate is that a few Veteran Ex-employee too are reportedly planning to play an active role in the proposed agitation.

6. While we expected our veteran retirees to play a constructive role in extending their support to the bank they passionately served for decades, the decision of some ex-employees to play a negative role against the bank's interest is taken by us with a concern and reservation.
