BJP Union Minister starts Punjab visit from Mohali

Assures panel of speedy resolution of land relief

MOHALI, AUGUST 30

Union Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat today began his Punjab visit from Mohali.

The minister met leaders of the Road Sangharsh Committee outside the District Administrative Complex and assured them of speeding the resolution of their demand for an appropriate compensation for the land acquired for the Bharatmala project. He was accompanied by former Health Minister Balbir Singh Sidhu, Punjab BJP general secretary Subhash Sharma, Mayor Amarjit Singh Sidhu and local BJP leader Sanjiv Vashisht.

Addressing the media near Gurdwara Amb Sahib, Shekhawat did not rule out the possibilities of changes in the state BJP for the betterment, but said at present, there was no need.

Though Sekhawat did not name Balbir as the probable BNP candidate for the Anandpur Shahib LS seat, sources said Sidhu might be a probable candidate in the 2024 elections. Commenting on BNP's

UIET told to refund fee

Had allotted seat in college against student's choice

The District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh, has held the University Institute of Engineering and Technology (UIET), Panjab University, guilty of deficiency in service for admitting a student despite his refusal, and not refunding the fee. The commission has directed the institute to refund the fee amount of Rs 38,000 to the student with interest and pay Rs 10,000 to him as compensation for causing mental agony and harassment, and Rs 7,000 as litigation costs.

Apurv Singhal, a student residing in Sector 48, in a complaint filed through counsel Devinder Kumar, said on August 8, 2018, he applied for the spot-round admission to the UIET by paying the participation fee of Rs 40,000. The final seat was supposed to be confirmed by the institute on

August 12. However, on August 9, he got a confirmation call for admission at Chitkara Engineering College, Banur. The same day, his mother sent an email to the Joint Admission Committee (JAC) stating that they wanted to opt out of the spot round, and requested for fee refund. On August 12, when he checked the website, he was surprised that a seat was allotted to him at Engineering College, Sector 26, Chandigarh. He again sent an email, followed by a representation dated October 11, praying for a fee refund, but to no avail.

The UIET authorities said the complainant had himself confirmed for participation in the spot round and accordingly, he was allotted a seat in CCET, Sector 26, Chandigarh, as per admission rules. The participation fee was not paid to the UIET but to the Joint Admission Committee 2018, which was transferred to the CCET on September 13. As the complainant was allotted

a seat, he had no claim to fee refund. Further, once the admission process was over, the JAC for that year ceased to have any control over any of the seats in any of the participating institutes.

After hearing of the arguments, the commission said it was very surprising that despite duly receiving information from the complainant regarding his refusal to participate in the admission process, the opposite party (UIET) admitted him on August 12 and offered him a seat. So far as their plea regarding fee in question lying with the CCET, or the JAC-2018 was concerned, both these parties were alien to the complainant. The acts of the opposite party in forcing the complainant to pursue education in an institute which was not of his choice/priority list, not responding to the email, not addressing his genuine request and not refunding fee certainly proved deficiency in service on its part.

PUCSC poll: Varsity panel holds meeting

CHANDIGARH, AUGUST 30

A meeting of a committee, comprising Panjab University (PU) Deans (Student Welfare), the Chandigarh Police SSP and students' representatives, was held at the Senate Hall, in anticipation of the coming elections of the Panjab University Campus Students Council (PUCSC).

The elections, which were not conducted in the past two years due to the Covid pandemic, are expected to be held in coming months.

The committee discussed that law and order should be maintained on the campus and outsiders' entry would not be allowed. Students' organisations should cooper-

ate with the authorities. Parties were warned against indulging in any type of illegal activity and violence.

Elections on Sept 23?

One of the students' political outfit claimed that the PU authorities proposed to hold elections on September 23. However, the authorities

denied any such development. "The elections are unlikely to be held on September 23, as the commencement of post-graduate classes is said to be on September 30. And as of now, there has been no change in this schedule. The authorities will take a final call on rescheduling, if possible," said a senior official. — TNS

PU announces golden chance

CHANDIGARH, AUGUST 30

Panjab University has announced a golden chance for the even semester students of all undergraduate courses (2014 onwards) and postgraduate courses (2015 onwards) and professional courses (as per regulations of the governing council/bodies) to clear their respective reappear(s)/compartment(s)/improvements/additional/deficient subjects/complete their respective degrees, who have exhausted all their permissible chances.

The examination fee will be Rs 10,000 for postgraduate students per class/semester (annual/semester system examinations) and Rs 5,000 for undergraduate students per class/semester (annual/semester system examinations). The SC/ST students will be granted a 50 per cent concession in the examination fee. The examination will be conducted in October in the physical mode only. Aspirants can submit the form by September 16 at ppxexam.puchd.ac.in and ugexam.puchd.ac.in. — TNS

'Fake' food safety officials on prowl, traders warned

The district Health Department has warned food business operators (FBOs) in the district against falling prey to fraudsters posing as food safety officers (FSOs).

Civil Surgeon Dr Adarshpal Kaur and District Health Officer Dr Subhash Kumar said it had come to their notice some miscreants posing as FSOs and food officers were demanding money from FBOs or shopkeepers against fake challans issued to them. They said the matter had come to light in some districts of Punjab.

The fraudsters were also demanding money for issuing medical fitness certificates to food handlers. "Medical fitness certificates can only be obtained from a registered medical practitioner or district and sub-divisional civil hospitals of Mohali district," they said.

The fraudsters were trying to

take advantage of the upcoming festival season in a bid to dupe traders, they said. The officials asked shop owners to inform the police or food safety wing of the Civil Surgeon's office on receiving such calls.

Dr Subhash Kumar asked shopkeepers, dairy owners, milkmen and those selling food items to report to the authorities any demand made for bribe or "monthly collection" in the name of health official or the food safety wing.

He reiterated issuance/modification of food safety licence/registration was done online and no physical submission of documents was required.

The registration certificate or licence could be obtained by applying online at www.foscos.fssai.gov.in for which government fee was charged, he added.

Son, daughter-in-law held for Amloh woman's murder

The district police today claimed to have solved the murder of a woman, identified as Bholi Goyal of ward number 13 in Amloh, within 24 hours with the arrest of her son and daughter-in-law, Honey Goyal and Arti Goel.

The police have registered a case under Section 302, IPC, against the couple on a complaint filed by Dharmbir Goyal, husband of the deceased.

Addressing the media, SSP Ravjot Grewal said Dharambir and Honey had complained to the Amloh police that uniden-

tified motorcycle-borne youths entered their house and murdered Bholi. Honey was also injured in the attack. A police team, under the supervision of Amloh DSP Jangit Singh, solved the case within a day. A tiff between the mother-in-law and the daughter-in-law led to the murder.

The DSP said when the police recreated the murder scene, Honey could not give a proper reply. Soon, he confessed to the murder. He admitted that they killed Bholi with a knife and cooked up a story to mislead the police. — OC

An awareness workshop on sexual harassment of women at workplace was today organised at the Model Jail by the Institute of Correctional Administration, Sector 26, Chandigarh.
