



Bank of Maharashtra celebrated Vigilance Awareness Week from 26.10.2015 to 31.10.2015 as per guidelines received from Central Vigilance Commission. This year the theme of observing the week was 'Preventive Vigilance as a tool of good governance'. The Bank observed this week all over India through its 34 Zonal Offices & especially in 5 cities of Aurangabad, Amravati, Ahmedabad, Nasik and Pune and organized various competitions such as, poems, slogans, posters and speech competition for the staff members in the Head Office and also for the students in various colleges and schools.

A special function was arranged on 30.10.2015 at Head Office, Pune, and Dr M.R. Kadole, Supdt of Police, Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), Anti Corruption Branch (ACB), Pune, was invited as a Chief Guest.

During his keynote address, Dr. Kadole gave stress on adopting various preventive vigilance tools to ensure good governance in the organization and to prevent frauds in the banks. The programme ended with 'vote of thanks' from Shri R.K. Pandey, General Manager & Chief Vigilance Officer, who also advised the staff to be vigilant in discharging the duties which will ensure the welfare of the organization and in the end that of the staff members.
