

## **“QUOTATION FOR PET FOR RECRUITMENT OF POs/MTs IN PSBs”**

**Bank of Maharashtra** has been nominated as Nodal Bank for the state of Maharashtra by IBPS Mumbai for conducting CWE-PO/MT--IV for recruitment of Probationary Officers/Management Trainees. As a part of this project it is decided to conduct Pre-exam training for the benefit of SC/ST/Minority Community candidates in the State of Maharashtra for recruitment of Probationary Officers /Management Trainees in PSBs.

There are 4 centers i.e. **Mumbai, Pune Aurangabad & Nagpur** where such trainings are to be conducted. The training programme will be of 6 days, in two sessions per day with 4 hours duration of a session covering following subjects.

- (1) REASONING
- (2) ENGLISH LANGUAGE
- (3) QUANTITATIVE APTITUDE
- (4) GENERAL AWARENESS (WITH SPECIAL REFERENCE TO BANKING INDUSTRY)
- (5) COMPUTER KNOWLEDGE

Quotations are invited from interested persons/institutions engaged in imparting trainings of above nature. The quotation must be submitted in sealed envelope addressed to The Deputy General Manager (HRM), Bank of Maharashtra, Head Office, “Lokmangal” 1501, Shivajinagar, Pune 411005, giving the cost of training per candidate per day per session. The envelope should be superscripted as **“QUOTATION FOR PET FOR RECRUITMENT OF POs/MTs IN PSBs -2014-15 ”**

The cost of training includes rent for venue, Test materials, and refreshment for candidates etc. Normally a Batch size should be of 50 candidates. In case of less number of candidates appear for training, the cost will be reimbursed for minimum **20** candidates. The training will be theoretical.

The quotations must reach to the Bank on or before-12.09.2014 by 5.00 p.m.

The sealed envelopes will be open on 13.09.2014, at 4.00 p.m. in the presence of Assistant General Manager, IR & HRD, HRM Deptt Head Office Pune in his cabin.
